Mission Statement

The purpose and goals of the Oklahoma Adoption Coalition are to:

- Promote adoption as a positive option for children who need the security of a permanent and nurturing family;
- Promote the best interest of the child as the primary focus of all adoption practices and laws;
- Promote a recognition of the rights, responsibilities and needs of all members of the adoption triad (birth parents, adoptive parents and children);
- Promote the use of licensed Child Placing Agencies for the delivery of adoption services, and
- Promote the development of quality standards for adoption practices within the legal, medical, social work, and mental health professions.



Types of Adoption

Birth parents select the adoptive family and how much contact they wish to maintain with the child after placement.

Closed Adoption No contact by phone, electronic media or in person.

Semi-Open Adoption Limited contact and exchange of information through the agency.

Open Adoption Contact direct by birth parents and adoptive parents through varies methods including in person, by phone, text, or other electronic social media.
